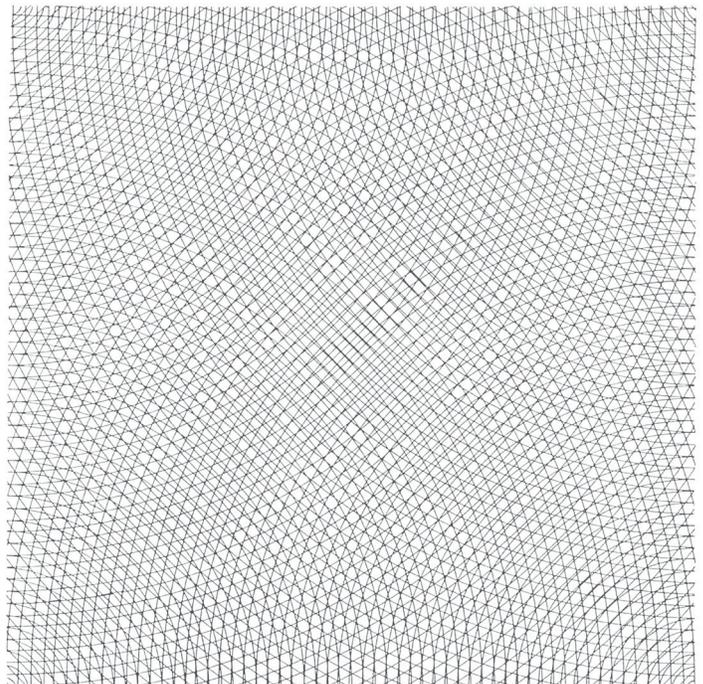
1. Sol LeWitt Drawing

In Conceptual art, the idea is the art. Sol Lewitt's *Wall Drawings* involve a set of written instructions given to a team of assistants. They make the actual drawing, rather than the artist. The instructions are simple and specific, but the interpretation of those instructions is up to the individual making the marks.

"Each person draws a line differently and each person understands words differently," LeWitt said.

In this workshop, participants interpret LeWitt's instructions to make a large drawing, much like solving a puzzle. The instructions describe the parts to create a drawing, with simple but adaptable directions such as:

- "Straight lines 4 inches long"
- "Place 50 points at random"
- "In four directions and colours"

2. Jeff Koons Figurine Painting

Jeff Koons is one of the most well-known artists working today. In 2019, his *Rabbit*, a stainless steel figure measuring just over three feet tall, sold for more than \$91 million USD, making it the most expensive work by a living artist ever to sell at auction. Over the course of his career, Koons has been interested in popular culture, reproducing ordinary objects and celebrating kitsch. For his series *Statuary*, his inspiration was decorative figurines (including the famous *Rabbit*) and trolls sold as lawn ornaments. *Cape Codder Troll* and *Mermaid Troll* are part of *The Sonnabend Collection* at Remai Modern.

In this workshop, participants choose a fun figurine they can personalize using acrylic paint and their imagination. Mix colours and patterns, taking inspiration from Koons and his Pop art predecessors like Andy Warhol and Roy Lichtenstein.

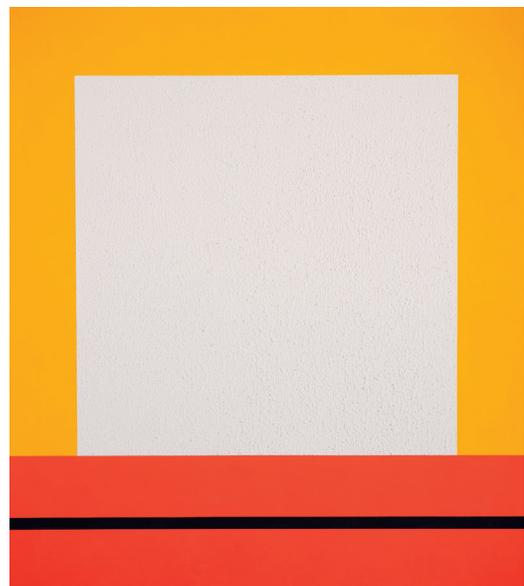

3. Minimalist Painting

Minimalism is an art movement characterized by the use of large, simplified, usually geometric forms. Minimalist painters use sharp edges, broad areas of colour and repeating shapes, highlighting order and simplicity. Artist Peter Halley, whose Minimalist piece *White Cell with Conduit* is included in *The Sonnabend Collection*, called this “seductive geometry”.

The unique, plastic characteristics of acrylic paint, a mid-20th-Century invention, allowed the Minimalists to explore intense colour, crisp, flat forms and harmony in painting. This workshop teaches participants the tricks of abstract painting to create a Minimalist canvas.



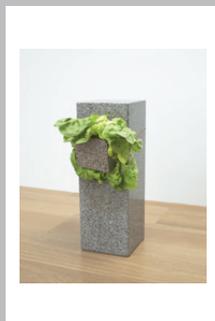
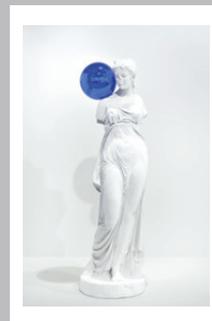
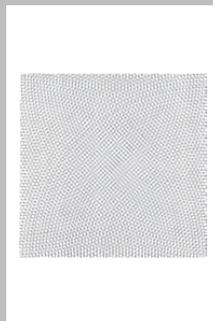
